There are a lot of important descriptors of Love in those verses and all are important, but too

often we think we can love one another while leaving out the kindness part. For Instance, in the book: *The Seven Principles for Making Marriage Work*, Dr. John Gottman shares how important it is to be kind to our spouse. He states too often we show more kindness to complete strangers than we show to those whom we profess to love! We all tend to fall into this trap with family with whom we are most familiar and yet we need to remember that our love is supposed to be kind.


Mission Update
