A Note from Jason,

On February 14th we will have an Ash Wednesday service here at Hebron at 7pm. As you all know Ash Wednesday begins the 40-day season of Lent in our Church year calendar. Often this season is seen as a downer time in the life of the church. It is a time of repentance, fasting, and denial. A time that emphasizes the fact that, as is said during the imposition of ashes: "you are dust and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). Compared to the celebrations of Christmas and Easter it really does seem to be dreary!



However, at its core, Lent is a season of humility—something I think our world desperately needs. On Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent we emphasize the fact that we are the creatures and not the creator, that we are sinful and imperfect people, and that we are dependent on God for all we have. While this might seem like a form of beating ourselves



up, what it's really about is recognizing the reality of our situation. This leads us to humble ourselves before God and others. This kind of humility when properly understood leads to true freedom.

How does it lead to freedom? It frees us from thinking that the weight of the world and even our own life is entirely on our shoulders. When we humble ourselves before God and others we don't have to hold onto our own ideas and opinions quite so tightly and it opens us to being changed by the Holy Spirit and even

appreciating other people's perspectives. Scripture reminds us again and again that to be humbled is not to be beaten down and be considered worthless, but instead it is to get to a place where we might be lifted up — "Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up" James reminds us (James 4:10)!

So, as we enter this season of Lent, I hope that as a church we at Hebron will collectively choose to humble ourselves before the Lord. Because when we do, God will open us up to all He has for us and indeed lift us up.


