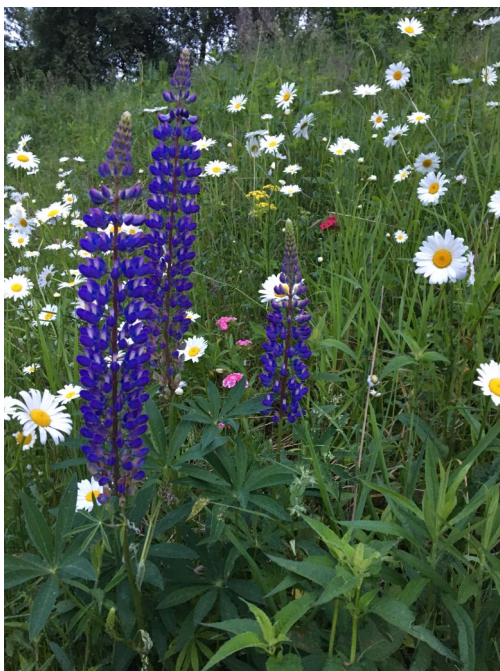


Hebron Happenings

A Note from Jason,

March is upon us and despite what Punxsutawney Phil says the season of Spring officially begins on March 20th. We might not always think of March as the beginning of Spring (more as the last month of winter) and yet with our having such a mild winter we are already starting to see signs of Spring sprouting up. This is what is so exciting about Spring – signs of new life rising from the dormancy and ‘death’ of winter.



The Bible often uses agricultural metaphors for describing the life of faith and life in the Kingdom of God. Prominent among these metaphors is the concept of new life springing forth from seeds in the ground. In fact, in the Gospel of John chapter 12 Jesus discussing his own death states: “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds” (John 12:23, 24). Jesus compares his death and resurrection to the planting of a seed. Once planted it springs forth to new life and then produces an abundant harvest which produces even more seeds that when planted produce even more and so goes the exponential growth of God’s kingdom!

So, as we progress through this season of Lent towards Holy week when we remember our Lord’s life, death and resurrection – might we also notice the exponential growth of new life springing forth from the ground all around us. And might

this new growth remind us of this spiritual reality - that this exponential growth of the Kingdom of God continues to this day. As Christ’s kingdom seed continues to be ‘planted’ in each of our hearts and we rise to new life in him producing a bountiful harvest.

To the earthquake victims in Turkey and Syria

A 7.8 magnitude earthquake near the Turkey-Syria border struck in the early hours of February 6, 2023. This earthquake is estimated to affect more than 23 million



people. Hebron has responded to this crisis by sending \$1,500.00 through the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

The Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is helping to meet immediate

needs in Turkey and Syria by distributing winterization items (blankets, mattresses), food items and medicines. This agency works alongside communities as they recover from disasters.

The Stories in Hebron's Stained Glass Windows
