

# Hebron Happenings

## A Note from Jason

Perspective is an interesting and important concept to the Christian faith. I remember when I was young watching Sesame Street and there being a wonderful song teaching about perspective. The song taught how your perspective could influence how big or small something looked. “That’s about the size, where you put your eyes, that’s about the size of it,” the lyrics went (I can still sing the tune to this day!). This is an important lesson for young children, to know that how you look at things has a significant impact on how we see and experience them – up close they might appear bigger and far away they might appear smaller.

The apostle Paul writes about this same phenomenon of perspective in his second letter to the Corinthians. He writes: “For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!” (2 Cor. 5:14-17).

According to Paul, the reality of Jesus’s life, death and resurrection should impact our perception – our point of view! Like moving closer or further away, like using a telescope or a microscope – how we see the world should be impacted by Jesus. So when we look at others we should no longer look at them from “a human point of view” but instead we should perceive them as one for whom Christ died and rose again! Since we are ‘in Christ’ we should look around us and not perceive the world in the ‘old’ way but instead we should be able to see signs of New Creation in Christ all around us.

Now this isn’t easy to do, even Paul admits to regarding people and the world from a human point of view from time to time and it is often easier, and we might say ‘more realistic’, to look at the world this way. However, we who are followers of the risen Jesus can no longer see the world this way. We need to adjust our perspective to a Jesus perspective and recognize the new breaking into the old. We need to remember that how we perceive the world is just as important as what we see. “That’s about the size, where we put our eyes” the song reminds us and the Apostle Paul agrees – our eyes should be on Jesus and His new creation.
