52 in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.

For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be

changed. 53 For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. 54 When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: “Death has been swallowed up in victory.”

55 “Where, O death, is your victory?

Where, O death, is your sting?”

56 The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. 57 But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.



This is a reminder that Christ has come to give us new life not just as disembodied spirits but a new life in a new imperishable physical body. Not that we know exactly what that entails but it is the promise of scripture. That we will live on the new earth with our imperishable bodies. This is the full hope of the Easter season we are celebrating.

I hope that as you reflect on this reality during this season you will be encouraged by this message that in Jesus, death has lost its sting because we know that it is not the end. “Thanks, be to God who gives us victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!”
